Mumm's Mumm Napa and Louis Roederer's Roederer Estate; and you can't forget native California sparkling wine house Schramsberg. Most California sparkling wines are made using *méthode traditionnelle*. These wines are elegant, but are often slightly more fruit-forward than French bubblys.

From crisp, lively and lip-smacking to rich, powerful, structured and creamy, the fruit profiles can range from apple and pear to tropical fruits and from unoaked to toasty.*

### NAPA VALLEY

*Chardonnays from Napa Valley are ripe, firm and full-bodied, with notes of green apple, pear, and citrus. Some producers use varying amounts of oak to add vanilla and toasty notes. Some try to preserve acidity levels by fermenting in stainless steel, while others use malolactic fermentation to add creaminess.*

More complex, and longer-lived than the Sangiovese produced in Chianti.*

#### “SUPER TUSCAN”

*Super Tuscan are red blends that stray from the strict laws governing the wines of Tuscany. The native Sangiovese grape is often blended with French varieties such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Syrah. Some bottle 100% varietal wines, a practice forbidden by many DOCs in Tuscany. The result of these experiments has been the creation of some of Italy's most sought after wines.*

### LEBANON

The improbable blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cinsault and Carignan from Lebanon's Bekaa Valley, gets at least a year on French oak, rests, and at year three is blended and bottle-aged for four more years prior to release. Drinkable upon release, these ageworthy, complex wines are best after at least ten years and just get better with age. The nose varies from wild herbs, earth, spice and anise to sweet fruit, tobacco and smoke. Musar reds are distinguished by two characteristics that are typically considered faults in most wines: volatile acidity (which conveys the smell of acetone) and Brett (its sensory compounds reminiscent of funky barnyard). Incredibly interesting wines.

### PORT

Ports are named after the city of Oporto in Portugal, where they have made these dense, sweet wines for more than 300 years. It is common for blends to contain a dozen or more varietals of the more than 80 that are grown in Portugal. The wines are then fortified with brandy to stop fermentation, and boosting alcohol levels to 18-20%.

### VINTAGE

Vintage ports come from a single year and are aged for two years in wood before maturing in bottle. These are top quality ports, but produced only three to four times per decade.

### MADEIRA

Owned by Portugal, Madiera is a small, volcanic island off the coast of Morocco that produces, perhaps, the world's most resilient wine. There are four basic styles of Madeira: Sercial, the driest, is noted for almond aromas, nerve, and a searing finish. Verdelho is medium-dry, smoky, with a tang of acidity. Bual is medium-rich with higher sugar levels and balanced acidity. Malmsey is the sweetest Madeira with notes of caramel, toffee and vanilla, and gets richer with age.

### SHERRY

These fortified wines from the city of Jerez in southwest Spain vary in style from Fino, a dry aperitif, to a richer, sweeter style like Oloroso. Sherry is produced by adding grape spirits to finished wine, then continuously blending together several different vintages stored in a series of casks, called a solera. Up to 33% of each cask can be withdrawn in any year and re-filled from recent vintages to ensure consistency of the finished wine. Oxidation plays an important role in the flavors of Sherry.
